

In the classroom and on the road with Bragg Elementary School students. Third grade teacher Lauren Stephens reached out to the CHS last fall looking to incorporate local history into the curriculum. The CHS was eager to support this initiative of educating Chester's youth about its past and historic treasures. Lessons were created based on information from The Scrapbook of History. The response to the material lead to the development of Historic Chester Bus Tours for the students. CHS Board members Len Taylor and Amanda Dean, were tour guides for the 150 third graders during their April 12th and 13th bus trips. The tours incorporated a map with points of interest, coloring book selections from Color Me Chester, and other visual aids, including Tippet bottles. One group of students was able to have a special stop at Cooper Mill with the help of Betty Mills and Ivins Smith. The tours were so well received that plans are already underway to run them again next year.

The date and time of the presentation will be announced at a later date. Len is unaware of this, so please do not mention it to him. We would like to surprise him.



Residents brought their "antique mysteries" for our guest experts, Bill Cogger, Karen Grossman, and Dan Silvershotz, to help solve. Over almost two hours they analyzed and assessed numerous items of jewelry, watches, paintings, fabric, pottery, kitchen tools, glassware, and furniture, difining their history and estimating their value. It was not only an entertaining evening, but an educational one, a mini-tutorial about the ups and downs of buying, selling, and appraising antiques.

Archives Report

There have been changes both in the Library and at our archives storage/work area at Highland Ridge.

We have made room in the Library for file cabinets that will hold copies of documents and photos, which will be available to the serious researcher (as well as the curious). We also have flat files (donated by CHS member and Chester Boro Historian, Ed Hanington) that will hold copies of maps and other large items that will be made accessible to the public. The CHS has purchased new, flat file cases that are specially manufactured to hold and preserve archival material. We have many original documents that will be permanently stored in these cases at Highland Ridge.

The Chester Library and the CHS have joined resources to put the Observer Tribune into a digital format, thus eliminating the need to store old newspapers. The CHS has copies of the Observer Tribune dating back to the 1950's in storage, and patrons of the Chester Library who have visited the Carmen Smith History Room have surely noticed the HUGE, HEAVY binders that hold OT newspapers from the Chester Library's collection. It takes two people to get them off of the shelves and three to put them back!

The digital version is available now on the library computers and will be available in the History Room at a future time. We will keep you updated regarding the availability. Many thanks to Chester Library Director, Lesley Karczewski, for obtaining a grant and arranging the digitizing of the collection, and to our President, Amanda Dean, for acting as CHS liaison in this endeavor and helping to move this project along.

In order to attain that goal, we need the help of our membership.
